#### C2668 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST OF MEMBERS

None declared.

## **C2669 COMMUNITY POLICING REPORT**

PCSO Heaps advised no burglaries, motor vehicle incidents, leasing with highways at Warrington Borough Council regarding signage for road works in Penketh. Trials being done regarding community speedwatch with a new speed gun. Complaints received regarding access along Windmill Road and dog fouling in the Penketh area and are liaising again with Warrington Borough Council regarding more bins and bags. Junction at Chapel Road has now been extended to prevent traffic turning right, however it has been noted this is still happening, plans in place to enforce correct usage of junction.

### C2670 ISSUES RAISED BY MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC.

Cllr D Baker advised members of the public, that Mini Masterplan and library, a planning application 2019/34281 and Penketh Carnival were to be discussed further in meeting and asked for any other items to be raised at this point.

A resident asked about the installation of paths around Greystone Recreational Ground and in

particular to the new benches that had recently been installed, it was agreed that these would improve the parks, however when tendered for they were very expensive to install, questions were asked about reserves held, an explanation given on last year funds depleting due to two by

elections and costs to remove Travellers from Penketh Parish Land.

Another resident asked about the maintenance of the planters along A562, Clerk advised a price from Warrington Borough Council had now been received and this was to be discussed in Part

two as it was of financial sensitivity.

Another resident advised that Penketh Fire station was to be reviewed at the end of the year, and he felt that Penketh needed to fight to keep the station fully open not just on call as he felt if any further loses lives would be lost. Cllr D Baker advised that Penketh Parish Council and Ward Councillors would liaise with parishioners to fight against any loss to the local Fire

services.

Another resident asked for a bin to be placed by new bus stop outside Penketh Gardens.

Resolved: Clerk to ask Warrington Borough Council whether a further bin was possible.

A resident introduced himself and advised that a letter had been forwarded to introduced Penketh and Cuerdley Residents Association and an invite to Parish Councillors to their next meeting. Cllr C Wych declared an interest at this stage. Clerk confirmed letter had been

received.

Resolved; Email of letter to be sent to Parish Councillors.

C2671 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

Clerk advised amendments to draft minutes had been received, as Full Council were not aware of changes it was requested changes were to be circulated before approval.

**C2672 MATTERS ARISING** 

Clerk advised a change of banking had previously been requested due to the local branch closing and difficulties with banking of cash at local Post Office due to recent changes. A brief discussion on benefits and all in favour of change.

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## Resolved: Clerk to instigate.

A question was raised whether pavements were being repaired in Chapel Road works, works were not planned and prioritization had been done in 2015/16.

Resolved: Clerk to ask whether when highways were being repaired if associated pavements could also be looked at, so residents were only inconvenienced once for any repair work.

Cllr G Fellows advised he had recently been walking the area looking at road and pavement conditions, he would update Parish Council accordingly. A further discussion was held it was re enforced that the request for pavements to be looked at along with highway works was a good idea however felt it may not be an option as this would set a precedent for the Borough, it was agreed some areas needed the pavements doing however highways would take priority. Advice was given that they were done on a risk factor basis depending on severity of problem and followed National funding criteria. It was asked whether due to the end of financial year works were done as if budget not used it would be lost, it was advised a lot of work was dependent on weather and catch up was sometimes needed.

## **C2673 CLERK'S REPORT**

Donation column was added to finance spreadsheet, Precept details had been sent to Warrington Borough Council, Clerk advised of the recent passing of George Warburton Cllr L Dirir then asked for all to stand for a minutes silence in memory of Mr Warburton. A tree had been felled at Heathside, it was advised the tree had an emergency Tree Preservation Order on since 2015 .A report had been sent to the Clerk on 13<sup>th</sup> February from Warrington Borough Council to explain the reasons behind the felling, and as on private land once approved no further notice for felling was required.

Item 9/15 two requests for updates on 'Master Plan'

There was a long discussion around Master Plan led in the first place by Cllr D Keane. Important points covered included: -

- The Parish Council is responsible for the pool and community hall. It is not responsible for the library however they do not want to lose the library.
- Several plans for the library had not come to fruition.
- There is a need for a regeneration plan for the area, this may include the Parish Council borrowing.
- A meeting had been held with Warrington Borough Council, Livewire and Cllr. D
  Keane over possible investments is the library, Pool and Youth Club and possibly the
  Local General Practice and Youth Club. The Management Company of Honiton Way
  Shops had no interest in being involved.
- It was important that all interested parties, including staff should be kept informed and possibly involved with any working group.

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• A Councillor pointed out that is was not a minuted meeting and therefore Cllr D Keane did not have a mandate.

A motion was put forward that Cllr. D Keane continue his discussions, as it had been stated no minutes had been taken when this had been discussed previously, with Warrington Borough Council and Live Wire and to report back in April's meeting. The voting was 6 in favour, 1 against and two abstentions.

Resolved: - that Cllr D Keane would continue his discussions with Warrington Borough Council and Live Wire and to report back in April's meeting.

It was further put forward that there should be a public meeting to take place in April. Voting on this was all in favour.

Resolved: - that a public meeting should be held in April over the Master Plan
