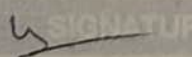

External auditor's limited assurance opinion 2023/24

On 29 September 2024, we issued a report detailing the results of our limited assurance review of Sections 1 and 2 of this authority's Annual Governance & Accountability Return for the year ended 31 March 2024. We explained that we were unable to certify completion of the review at that time. We are now in a position to certify completion of the review.

The external auditor report given in Section 3 of the Annual Governance & Accountability Return requires amendments as follows:

Except for the matters reported below, on the basis of our review of Sections 1 and 2 of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR), in our opinion the information in Sections 1 and 2 of the AGAR is in accordance with Proper Practices and no other matters have come to our attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met.

The AGAR was not accurately completed before submission for review. Please ensure that amendments are corrected in the prior year comparatives when completing next year's AGAR.:

- Section 2, Box 9 for the current year is incorrect and should read £1,188,788.

Other matters not affecting our opinion which we draw to the attention of the authority:

The smaller authority has confirmed that it has not complied with the governance Assertions in Section 1, Boxes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 and it has provided the appointed auditor with an explanation for non-compliance in relation to a general lack of internal control over the budget process and payments. The smaller authority has provided details of the actions necessary to address weaknesses identified.

The smaller authority has not provided:

- an adequate explanation for the variance between the prior and current year values in Box 3 and 4 of Section 2.
- an adequate explanation for the difference between Boxes 7 and 8 of Section 2.

It was not clear whether the classification of expenses for Boxes 4 and 6 for the current and prior year has been correctly carried out. Please restate Boxes 4 and 6 in next year's prior year comparatives if appropriate.

The Practitioners Guide states that Financial Regulations need to be 'regularly reviewed', however as was noted previously, the Financial Regulations have not been updated since July 2021, therefore the smaller authority should consider this when responding to Assertion 2 of the 2024/25 AGAR.

It was noted that not all bank accounts are in the name of the parish council, and this was also raised in the prior year external auditor report.

The smaller authority has not arranged for an independent internal auditor to review the internal controls and give their conclusion in the Annual Internal Audit Report. If no internal audit work is carried out before 31 March 2025, it must disclose this by answering 'No' to Assertion 6 of the Annual Governance Statement on the 2024/25 AGAR. In future years, the smaller authority must maintain an adequate and effective system of internal audit of the accounting records and control systems.
